

## TISA Alignment to UN SDG Global Core Indicators

The Disruption House (TDH) materiality assessment maps clients' Environmental (E), Social (S) and Governance (G) capabilities to the UN SDGs which are universally accepted as examples of sustainable good practice.

Based on data submitted by TISA in August 2023, TDH finds that TISA is making significant progress towards 5 of the UN SDGs:

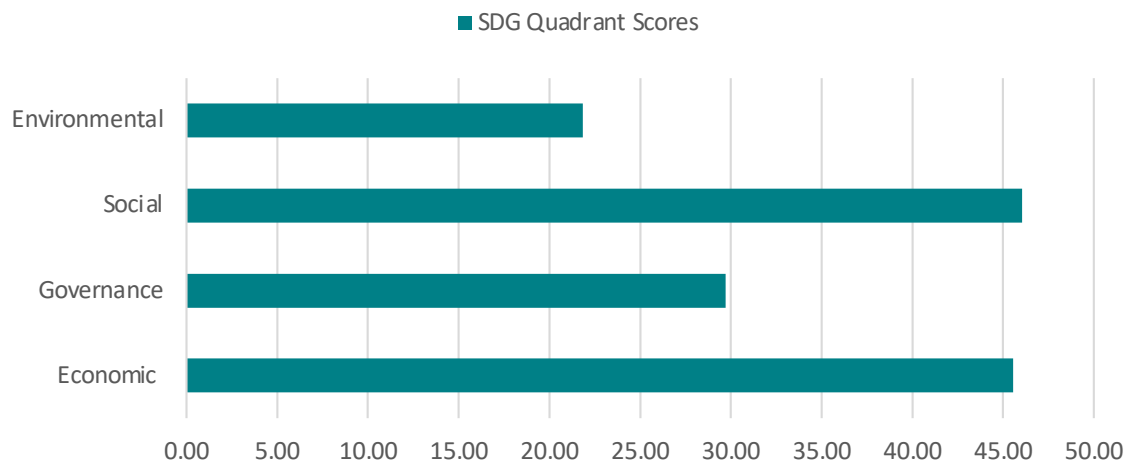


- ✓ 8 Decent Work and Economic Growth

- ✓ 10 Reduced Inequalities
- ✓ 16 Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions
- ✓ 17 Partnerships for the Goals

### UN Global Core Indicators

In the last few years, SDGs have been enthusiastically adopted by companies wishing to showcase their sustainable credentials. However loose interpretation, lack of controls and subjective implementation of the goals are undermining the purpose and integrity of the SDGs by companies and asset managers, increasing the risks of greenwashing rather than preventing them.

Recognising the practical limitations of the UN SDGs for corporate reporting purposes the UN has developed a more applicable set of Core Indicators that can be adopted by any company of any size so that they can show transparently how their goals and actions are contributing towards meeting the SDGs 2030 deadlines. The four pillars include. Environmental, Social, Governance and Economic.
